Midsumma is Australia's premier queer arts and cultural organisation, bringing together a diverse mix of LGBTQIA+ artists, performers, communities and audiences year-round.

In 2023, Midsumma Festival will expand over 23 days of summer, with a rainbow of queer events that highlight emerging and mainstream LGBTQIA+ arts and culture. Kip Mac is a classically-trained pianist and singer who specialises in hardcore, metal, grunge, and punk on piano. They are also autistic. Kip's work showcases the melodies beneath the distortion and shares the stories and cultural moments behind the songs.
