

Accessibility Champions Brief Sheet

General Brief

- Main tasks include welcoming guests to the street party, aid with patrons who require access assistance in enjoying the party. This may include way-finding or walking patrons to parts of the precinct. Advise on access provisions that the festival provides and inform them of stalls relating to community access provision.
- There is an accessible drop-off area at the intersection of Smith St & Charles St in Collingwood.
- Public have been advised they can reach the Accessibility Champions to request support by contacting volunteers at Smith St & Charles St via mobile phone designated to the accessibility champion volunteers. (Phone Number: **0437 557 109**) or at the Info Booth (who will then radio through to Accessibility Champion).
- Information Tent and Wheelchair charger located on Gertrude St, near George St.
- There will be Auslan interpretation for most performances.

This Role Suits

- Might require some walking on uneven grass.
- Is comfortable answering the Accessibility phone.
- Has a good understanding of various accessibility requirements.

On Arrival

- Go to Volunteer HQ at LCI to sign on and collect your accreditation, accessibility phone and map.
- Meet up with Volunteer Coordinator at Volunteer HQ, who will brief you on your role.

Sensitivity

- Many people who attend, volunteer or perform at Victoria's Pride represent diverse communities which may be at risk or prone to discrimination. Keep watch for anti-social crowd members and call for assistance through the EOC or security if required.
- Use gender-neutral pronouns until the person identifies their pronouns.

- Please come back to Volunteer HQ at LCI to sign out.
- You are then free to enjoy the festival. Please change out of your volunteer t-shirt and accreditation at this time.
